

The next phase of construction is set to begin at the Willogoleche Wind Farm.

From late June, works will take place to install an ElectraNet substation to support the export of energy from the 119MW wind farm to the national energy grid.

The substation will be located near the junction of Ashby and Willalo Roads, just south of the intersection, on Ashby Road.

Nearby residents can expect to see a small increase in traffic movements around the site until the end of August.

Key points

- Willogoleche Wind Farm is planned to be operational by the middle of 2018.
- The project consists of 32 turbines on 85 metre-high towers, with 63.5 metre blades.
- The closest turbine will be about 3.2km west of Hallett, with the furthest turbine 8.3km to the south west.
- The majority of turbines will be about 5km from the township.
