
species that inhabit the reserve.

As an organisation whose fundamental business is the production of energy Loy Yang B continually looks for efficiency improvement opportunities as a normal business function.

A number of projects have been implemented to improve energy and resource efficiency.



Environment

Loy Yang B recognises its responsibilities and the important role it plays in protecting the environment, helping to ensure a sustainable future.

Loy Yang B power station is committed to generating a reliable source of electricity in a safe, socially and environmentally responsible way.

Loy Yang B has an accredited environmental management system (EMS) meeting the requirements of AS/NZS ISO14001 that was first certified in 1996. Loy Yang B has adopted an integrated approach to quality, safety and environment management systems and will, where at all possible, use common systems and documentation.

Each boiler at Loy Yang B requires approximately 600 tonnes/hour of brown coal which amounts to ~10million tonnes of coal per annum with a greenhouse intensity factor of ~1.24 tonnes CO₂-e/MWHR Sent Out.

Loy Yang B operates under the requirements of an accredited EPA licence 3987 which prescribes mass rate limits for emissions to atmosphere and other conditions. The organisation has a well-established monitoring program that is regularly reviewed to ensure licence requirements are met. An excellent track record in environmental performance means that Loy Yang B regularly operates below licence limits.
