SALVAGE PLANS

What are you going to do with all the plant and equipment at Hazelwood?

As part of the decommissioning phase of the Power Station and Mine, an inventory will be undertaken of all plant and equipment suitable for salvage and eventual sale. This is a large and complex project that requires external expertise, so ENGIE is putting this out to tender.

How will the salvaged items be sold?

There are two streams in place for the sale of items across the site. The first will be managed in-house by Hazelwood and include an offer for employees to place bids for various items. The second is a tender for 'valuation and auction services' which will include all other items such as inventory, furniture, plant items plus tools and equipment. The successful tenderer will decide on the sale process, however many of these large scale industrial sales are now conducted online.

Who will buy the salvaged items?

Before anything is sold externally, it will be determined what, if any, additional equipment will be needed by the Mine to support ongoing rehabilitation. Current Hazelwood employees will then be invited to take part in an 'Expression of Interest' process. Other ENGIE in Australia assets have also been invited to lodge their interest in any items. Since the closure of the business was announced, a number of external people have expressed an interest in some things and these names will be given to the auctioneers who will contact them prior to the sale.



What happens to any heritage listed items?

An inventory of historical items will be undertaken and further discussion held with appropriate organisations. No heritage listed items will be included as part of the salvage project.

Will local community charities, groups and schools be offered any of the equipment?

Yes, requests for donations are welcome and will be assessed as part of the above processes.
