Hazelwood Rehabilitation message reaches cricket fans

Big Bash cricketers were in action for the first time in in the Latrobe Valley last Friday night and ENGIE Hazelwood was among the display stands that accompanied the event.

Hundreds of people flocked to the Traralgon Recreation Reserve to see the Melbourne Stars and Hobart Hurricanes play a pre-season Big Bash contest.
