PROJECT MANAGER'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the latest edition of the Hills of Gold Wind Farm newsletter.

It was great to catch up with members of the community when several members of the team were in Nundle in late April to host the Department of Planning and Environment for a site visit of the project.

To keep you updated on the project's approval pathway, the Request for Information (RFI) has now been formally lodged with Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) for their assessment. We are expecting the DPE to make their recommendation to the NSW Independent Planning Commission (IPC) in Q3 of 2023. The IPC, as the decision-making body, will undertake further assessment to make their determination on the project.

We are all very keen to know the outcome of the project and we thank you all for your continued input and support of the project.

Finally. ENGIE has opened applications for the 2023 Community Sponsorship Program offering one off cash payments of up to \$10,000 with a total of \$50,000 in funding available to local community groups. "It was great to provide sponsorship for this event that not only brings schools together from across the region, but also encourages students with a keen interest in science and engineering to develop their skills and have some fun at the same time."

"The Challenge allows students to work as a team, learn problem. solving skills and consider a career path in a range of sectors including the growing renewable energy industry," Ms Anderson said.

The annual event is presented by the University of Newcastle in partnership with the Tamworth Rotary Club First Light. Event coordinator. Steve Hawkins said the 2023 challenge was a great success with 1,024 students coming together

"The event originated in Tamworth over twenty-five vears ago and has grown to be a nationwide competition. It's a wonderful opportunity for these kids to show off their skills and ingenuity.

The criteria for successful applications will enhance or promote tourism, arts or culture. promote sustainability, contribute to improving education and training or improve socioeconomic conditions in the local community.

"This sponsorship program will provide oneoff cash contributions of up to \$10,000 to successful applicants, and is in addition to the \$150,000 construction fund, which funds local projects during the construction phase of the wind farm," said Ms Niemand.
