The proposed Willogoleche Stage 2 Wind Farm is located approximately 5km from the town of Hallett, South Australia, on the lands of the Ngadjuri people.

The wind farm is situated adjacent to ENGIE's operational Willogoleche Wind Farm, which was commissioned in 2019 and has a capacity of 119 MW. Situated in an area of South Australia which is well-known for its blustery, windy conditions, its location is ideal for the additional development.
